

NO SULFA DRUGS!



The following is a list of sulfa based drugs. Irish Water Spaniels may have a <u>FATAL REACTION to SULFA DRUGS</u> and should not be treated with such unless the benefits clearly outweigh the risk of <u>DEATH</u>

The two most common sulfa drugs in the US are:

Bactrim

Tribressin (sometimes called Tribussin)

The following antibiotics are based on Potentiated Sulphonomides and **should not be given** to the Irish Water Spaniel:

Co Trimoxazole
Sulphamethoxazole
Trimethroprim
Tribrissen/DiTrim
Delvoprim
Dulphatrim Sulphadiazine Trimethroprim
Microtrim
Norodine
Septra
Scoprin
Borgal Sulphadioxine Trimethroprim
Zaquilan Sulphadimethoxine Baquiloprim

NB Septrim and **Bactrim** are brand names for **Co-trimoxazole** so do not accept these as an antibiotic for your dog either. **Co-trim** may be used as an abbreviation for **Co-trimoxazole**.

The medicines **Amphoprimol**, **Sulfatrim** and **Delfoprim**, which are used in Holland, also have the same combination of ingredients and should not be given to an IWS.

NO INJECTABLE / HIGH DOSES OF IVERMECTIN!

Ivermectin administered in <u>HIGH DOSES (ORAL OR INJECTIBLE)</u>, has also been found to cause fatalities in the Irish Water Spaniel. One of the more common reasons for high doses of Ivermectin include treatment of mange/scabies or other parasites. The amount of Ivermectin contained in Heartgard monthly heartworm treatment, poses no threat provided it is administered as directed
